



Fund: Japanese Government Scholarships

- Specifically, it called Monbukagakusho (or MEXT: Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology) scholarship.
- All application procedures for the MEXT scholarships are conducted through Japanese embassies, consulates in your countries, or <u>institutions of higher</u> <u>education in Japan.</u>
- · Priority areas: Indonesia, Thailand, Vietnam, Malaysia, Bangladesh
- China, Taiwan, the U.K, etc are not eligible for the application
- Number of candidates to be recommended by PHU: 3
- Deadline for application: A litter after mid-January

6. Opprotunities (cont'd)

Project: Intl. Exchange Program

- PUH-sponsored project conducted by our department
- One-off up to 1 million JPY
- Condition: 5 or more students and 1 or more members of faculty from a overseas sister university, staying 7 or more days for the visit.
- Coverage: air tickets and hotel fees, etc, usually not including meal bills.
- Exceeded expenses must be paid by the visitors
